





- Alexandra is a densely populated and diverse ward in the centre of Oldham, which has experienced a 20% increase in estimated population between 2011 and 2018. This is much higher than the Oldham wide average increase of 3.9%.
- It has a high proportion of residents of Pakistani heritage compared to the Oldham average.
- It has a high proportion of residents under the age of 16 compared to the Oldham average.
- Since 2001, this ward has become younger and more diverse due to the growth in its South Asian communities.



- Alexandra is one of Oldham's most deprived wards, and has the third lowest median household income in the borough.
- There is a higher dependency on out-of-work benefits (16.6%) than the Oldham average (11.0%)
- Levels of employment (46.7%) are lower than the Oldham average (58.2%). Around one in four are employed on a full time basis.



- Alexandra's housing stock has a large proportion of socially rented properties (41.8%) and a growing number of private rented properties (16.1%).
- The average sold house price in the ward is around a third lower than the Oldham average.
- Large proportions of households are receiving Council Tax Reduction and/or Housing Benefit (34.7%), have pre-pay energy meters (39%), are in Fuel Poverty (17.5%), and only a third (34%) can afford to keep their house in a decent state of repair.





- 61.4% of pupils in Alexandra leave the Early Years Foundation stage with a Good Level of Development. This compares to 68.1% in Oldham as a whole.
- 50% of boys in Alexandra enter the Early Years Foundation Stage with a Good Level of Development.
- 50% of pupils in Alexandra attain Grade 4 or above in English and Maths GCSE.
- 5.4% of pupils in Alexandra gain no GCSE passes, the highest rate in the borough.
- Adult qualifications are also relatively low.



- Alexandra has the lowest life expectancy in Oldham for both males and females.
- The rate of deaths for those aged 75 or older is the highest in the borough.
- The rate of death from cancer for those aged under 75 is the highest in the borough. Smoking rates are high.
- Breastfeeding rates are good, but by year 6 childhood obesity is high compared to Oldham as a whole.



- The overall rate of reported crimes is higher than the Oldham average.
- Police intelligence suggests a fall in the rate of reporting. New crime recording standards have changed the classification of certain offences, meaning we can't compare over time.



The Alexandra Ward stretches from Ashton Road to Holts Village on the outskirts of Lees, with neighbourhoods sitting either side of the green corridor starting at Alexandra Park and running through to Park Bridge.

To the West, the neighbourhood of Hathershaw has a large proportion of privately rented properties, and pockets of social housing managed by different providers. The area is a mix of Pakistani and White-British households, and recent years have seen an increase in the number of families from different backgrounds, in particular those of Eastern European heritage. To the North of Hathershaw lies Eldon Street Estate, a compact area of social housing, mostly flats, managed by First Choice Homes.

On the other side of Alexandra Park, the Glodwick community from St Mary's Ward extends into the housing running down Abbeyhills Road. Further down, there is a development of newer private housing clustered around the lower end of Warren Lane.

The Eastern end of the Ward is largely taken up by two large First Choice Homes housing estate – Alt and Holts. These areas can be relatively isolated because of their geographic situation, and relative lack of public transport access. However, they benefit from close proximity to local countryside in Lees Brook and towards Hartshead Pike.
