





- Crompton's population size has been decreasing steadily since 2001.



- A lower proportion of people are on Out of Work Benefits in Crompton (7.7%) than in Oldham as a whole (11.0%).



- Crompton's housing stock has a large proportion of owner occupied properties (80.3%) and a growing number of private rented properties (8.2%).
- The average sold house price in the ward is 7.6% higher than the Oldham average.
- A low proportion of households are receiving Council Tax Reduction and/or Housing Benefit (12.0%), have pre-pay energy meters (15%), or are in Fuel Poverty (9.1%). Two thirds (68%) can afford to keep their house in a decent state of repair.







- Crompton outperforms the Oldham average at every life stage.
- 70.7% of pupils in Crompton leave the Early Years Foundation stage with a Good Level of Development. This compares to 68.1% in Oldham as a whole.
- 63.6% of pupils attain Grade 4 or above in English and Maths GCSE, compared with 56.1% in Oldham as a whole.
- 3.4% of pupils gain no GCSE passes, compared with 2.7% in Oldham as a whole.

- Crompton's Male Life Expectancy (78.0 years) is slightly higher than the Oldham wide average for males (77.2 years).
- Crompton's Female Life Expectancy (82.3 years) is higher than the Oldham wide average for females (80.9 years).
- A lower proportion of Year 6 children (17.1%) are obese than in Oldham as a whole (23.4%).





Road Traffic Accidents

- Crompton's rate of reported Anti-Social Behaviour is lower than the average for the borough.
- The overall rate of reported crimes is much lower than the Oldham average. For many crime types, the rate is less than half the borough average.
- Police intelligence suggests a fall in the rate of reporting.



The Crompton ward is the most north westerly ward in the borough and shares a border with Rochdale. A large part of the ward is semi-rural, with a large number of farms and greenspaces. High Crompton Park is a popular and well used community facility with an active bowling community and the ward also has well used playing fields at New Barn.

The ward had a high proportion of well maintained, owner occupied housing with relatively low levels of social housing and private rented accommodation.

Crompton ward has an ageing population. The ageing population presents an urgent challenge to the community in terms of we ensure we age-well where we live and the community is accessible and inclusive.
