



- **Households in Fuel Poverty** (Oldham average - 12.1%)
- Hollinwood's housing stock has a low proportion of owner occupied properties (46.1%), a high proportion of social housing (39.5%), and a growing number of private rented properties (13.1%).
- The average sold house price in the ward is 7.3% lower than the Oldham average.
- 35% of households use pre-pay energy meters, and fuel poverty rates are relatively high.





- 68.9% of pupils in Hollinwood leave the Early Years Foundation stage with a Good Level of Development. This compares to 68.1% in Oldham as a whole.
- 40.5% of pupils attain Grade 4 or above in English and Maths GCSE, compared with 56.1% in Oldham as a whole.
- 3.9% of pupils gain no GCSE passes, compared with 2.7% in Oldham as a whole.
- Adult qualification levels are low.







Hollinwood is a small ward, with approximately 12,000 residents. The area is divided by Hollins Road, which is the main route for travel to Oldham, accompanied by the Hollinwood Metrolink Stop which is located off Hollinwood Avenue. The North side is of mixed tenure including owner occupiers, private landlords and social housing, First Choice Homes Oldham being the main landlord. Across the road are Limeside and Limehurst which are predominantly Regenda (Limehurst) and Onward Homes (Limeside), and further up Hollins Road is the more affluent area of Garden Suburbs. Hollinwood is included in the council's selective licensing area where landlords can be held to account. Key stakeholders within the ward are working together to make a difference and tackle some of the long standing issues. There are various projects run by different agencies including helping people into employment or training, giving residents the options of works in its own allotments and there are number of volunteering opportunities within the ward. Various regeneration projects are planned for Hollinwood including housing, retail, and entertainment units.
