



- 78.8% of pupils in Shaw leave the Early Years Foundation stage with a Good Level of Development. This compares to 68.1% in Oldham as a whole.
- 63% of pupils attain Grade 4 or above in English and Maths GCSE, compared with 56.1% in Oldham as a whole.
- 1.4% of pupils gain no GCSE passes, compared with 2.7% in Oldham as a whole.







Shaw hosts the district centre with a thriving retail community. There is also a well-loved library, Children's Centre, and Lifelong Learning Centre which are valuable and well used community resources.

Shaw has a very strong local identity and there is above average satisfaction rate amongst resident with Shaw as a place to live.

Shaw ward has green space including with Crompton Moor, Dunwood Park, and George St playing fields, all providing leisure and wellbeing opportunities for local residents. There are also high levels of community involvement in these areas with very active volunteer groups who care passionately about the local environment and the local community.

There is a very active Events group which working with ward members organise the annual and ever popular Christmas lights event.
