




- St James' population has risen steadily in each of the three broad age bands since 2011.
- The 65+ population has grown at the fastest rate increasing in size by 20% between 2011 and 2018. However, numbers are low, and most growth is driven by an increasing schoolage population.
- The ward is predominantly (94.5%) White, and indeed became more white over the previous decade.







- 64% of pupils in St James' leave the Early Years Foundation stage with a Good Level of Development. This compares to 68.1% in Oldham as a whole.
- GCSE outcomes are below average. 53% of pupils attain Grade 4 or above in English and Maths GCSE, compared with 56.1% in Oldham as a whole. 3.7% of pupils gain no GCSE passes, compared with 2.7% in Oldham as a whole.
- Adult skills are just below borough averages.







St James' Ward comprises the communities "up the hill" (Moorside and Sholver), and "down the hill" (Derker and part of Watersheddings.) Derker is split into "Top" and "Bottom" Derker, and divided between private and social housing. Anti-social behaviour is a worry for local people, but there is a strong sense of identity in the area, and people come together around the fantastic Stoneleigh Park. Access to the Metrolink has allowed young people in particular to travel more widely within Oldham and beyond. Vacant housing plots have been a concern for some time, but these are now starting to be developed. The journey up and down the hill can sometimes serve to isolate the residents of Sholver, but people make good use of local amenities, including the shops on Coleridge Road and Ripponden Road, and community activities at Sholver Community Centre, Fulwood Nature Reserve and the St James' Children's Centre. More recently, local people have expressed concerns about the possible impact of proposed development in the area.

Moorside is a more affluent area, with a slightly older population, and larger family housing. There is easy access to the countryside via Strinesdale, and Moorside Cricket Club provides a valuable focal point for the community. Local people tend to be concerned about the possibility of housing development in the area.
