

- 28.9% of St Mary's housing stock is social rented properties, compared to 21.1% in Oldham as a whole.
- The average sold house price in the ward is 46% lower than the Oldham average.
- 33% of households are receiving Council Tax Reduction and/ or Housing Benefit, and 28% have pre-pay energy meters (5%).
- Only 33% can afford to keep their house in a decent state of repair. Fuel poverty is also the second highest in the borough,





- 58.3% of pupils in St Mary's enter the Early Years Foundation stage with a Good Level of Development. This compares to 68.1% in Oldham as a whole.
- 45.3% of pupils attain Grade 4 or above in English and Maths GCSE, compared with 56.1% in Oldham as a whole.
- 3.3% of pupils gain no GCSE passes, compared with 2.7% in Oldham as a whole.





- St Mary's rate of reported Anti-Social Behaviour is higher than the average for the borough.
- The overall rate of reported crimes is considerably higher than the Oldham average. This is due to parts of the town centre falling within St Mary's, and the town centre having a high concentration of crime due to the concentration of shops.
- Police intelligence suggests a fall in the rate of reporting.



The ward of St Mary's is split in half by the town centre and Mumps area. To the North of this, the estates around Egerton Street, Higginshaw and St Mary's (all predominantly composed of social housing) are well-served by their close proximity to the facilities in the town centre. South of Mumps is the neighbourhood of Glodwick. The community here is predominantly of Pakistani heritage, but there is also a small Bangladeshi section of the community. People here are well-served by local shops, places of worship, and community organisations. There is a high proportion of owner-occupiers.

Further East, the Glodwick area runs into the area around Roundthorn and South Clarksfield. While still mostly private housing, there is a larger prevalence of privately let properties. The area is a mix of Pakistani and White-British households, and recent years have seen an increase in the number of families from different backgrounds, in particular those of Eastern European heritage. The vacant site on Roxbury Avenue is now being developed as a new secondary school. Principle concerns across most of the communities in this ward revolve around crime and environmental issues.
