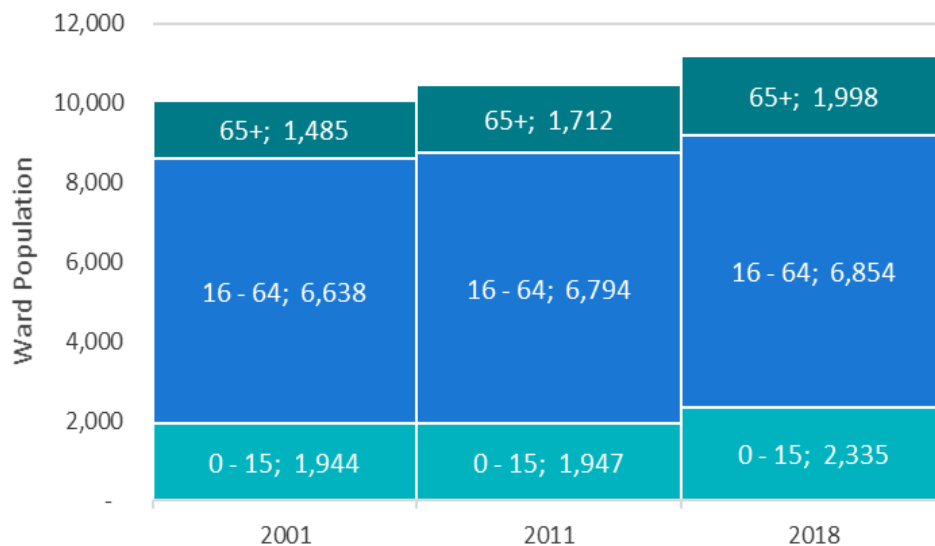


- Chadderton Central's population increased by an estimated 6.7% between 2011 and 2018. This is greater than the Oldham wide average increase of 3.9%.
- The estimated size of the 0 to 15 year old population increased by 18% between 2011 and 2018.
- Since 2001, this ward has seen a growth in the proportion of non-white residents (predominantly in the East of the ward) with significant growth in the Bangladeshi communities.

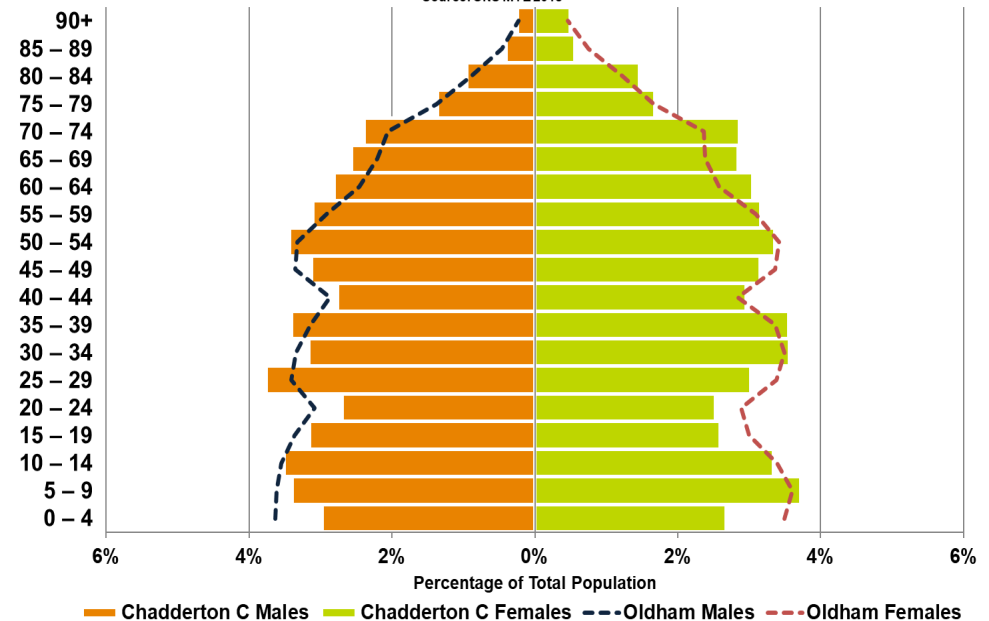

- A greater proportion of Chadderton Central's residents are employed full time (42.6%) than the Oldham average (36.6%).

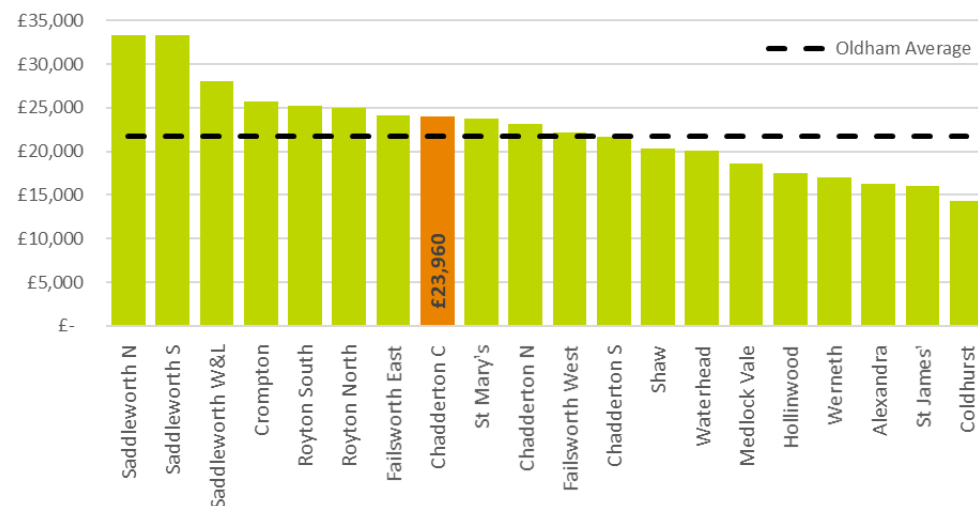

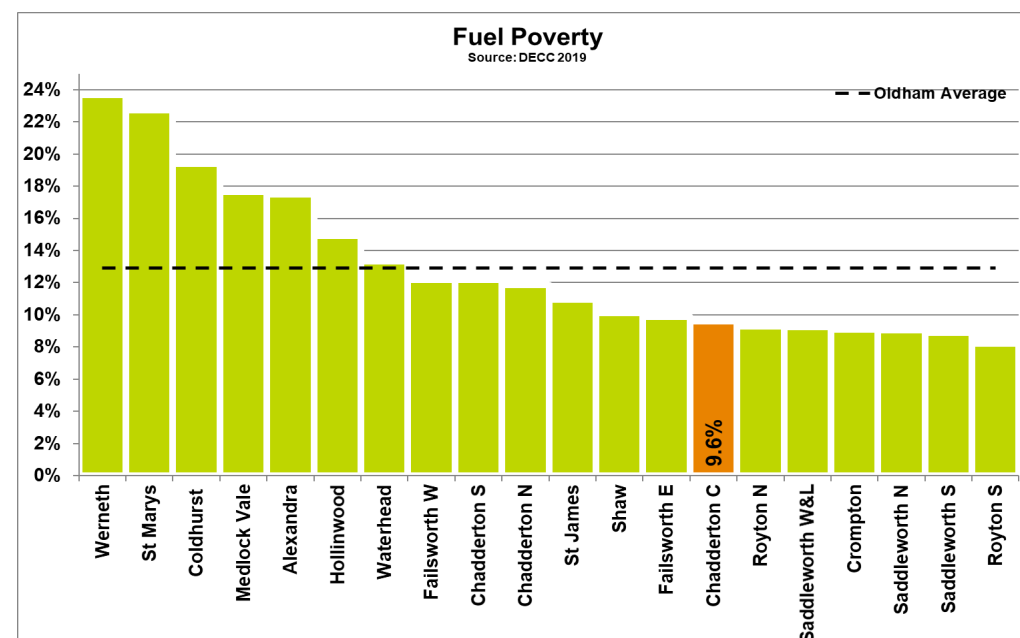

- Chadderton Central's housing stock has a large proportion of owner occupied properties (74.6%) and a growing number of private rented properties (12.2%).
- The average sold house price in the ward is similar to the Oldham average.
- A low proportion of households are receiving Council Tax Reduction and/or Housing Benefit (15.2%), have pre-pay energy meters (14%), are in Fuel Poverty (9.6%), and two thirds (65%) can afford to keep their house in a decent state of repair.

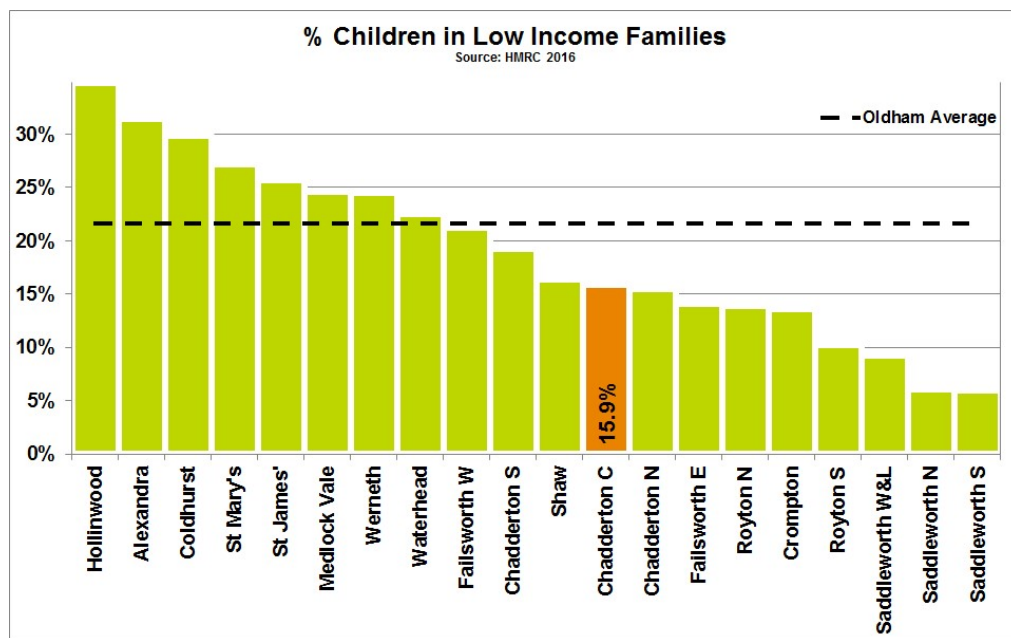

- 1.6% of pupils gain no GCSE passes, compared with 2.7% in Oldham as a whole.

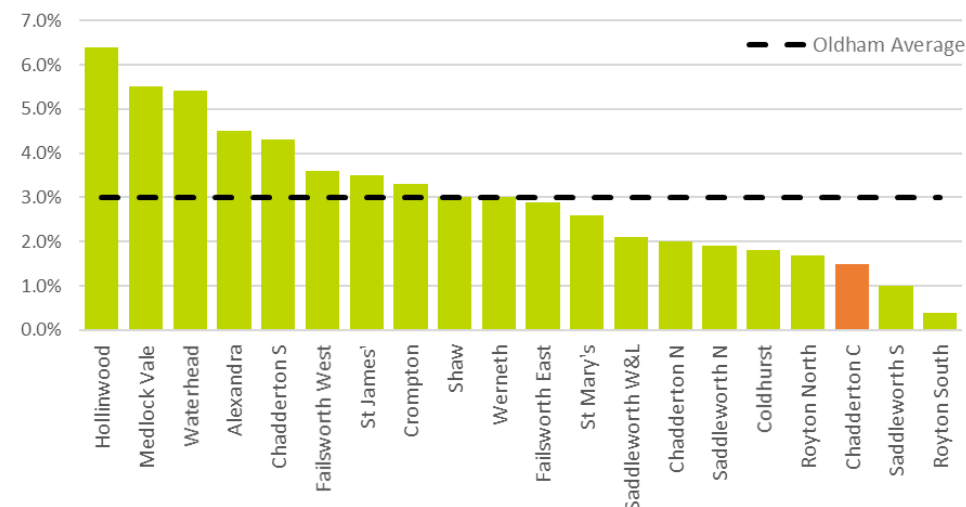

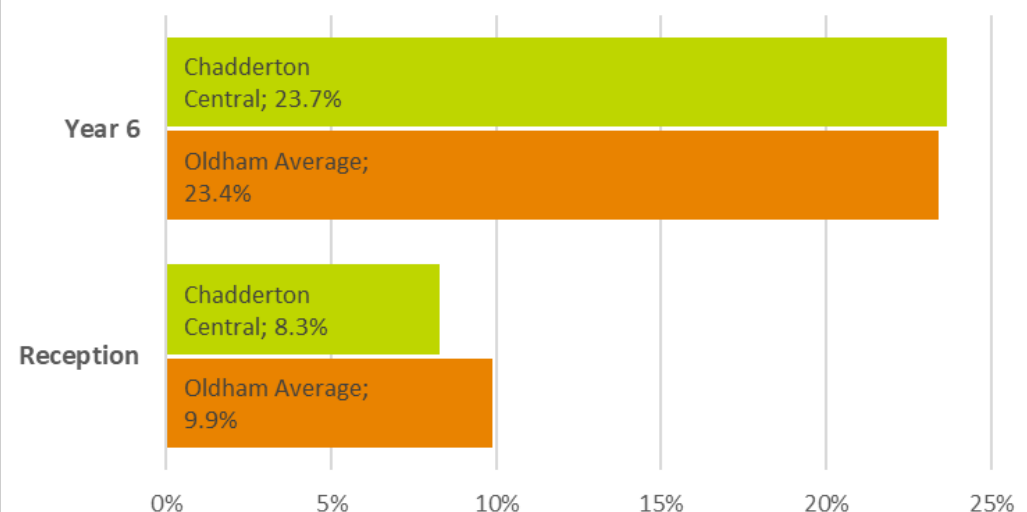

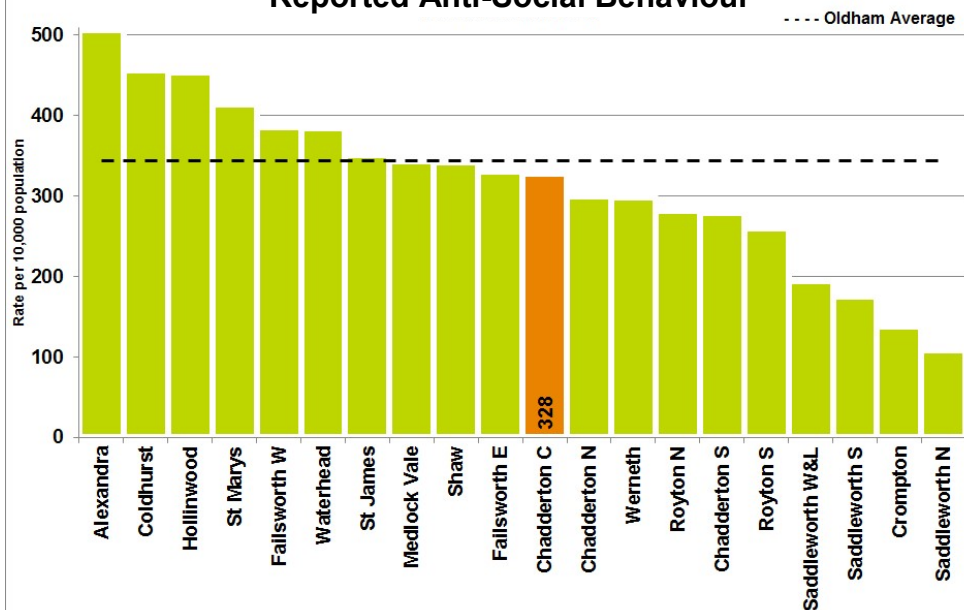
Road Traffic Accidents

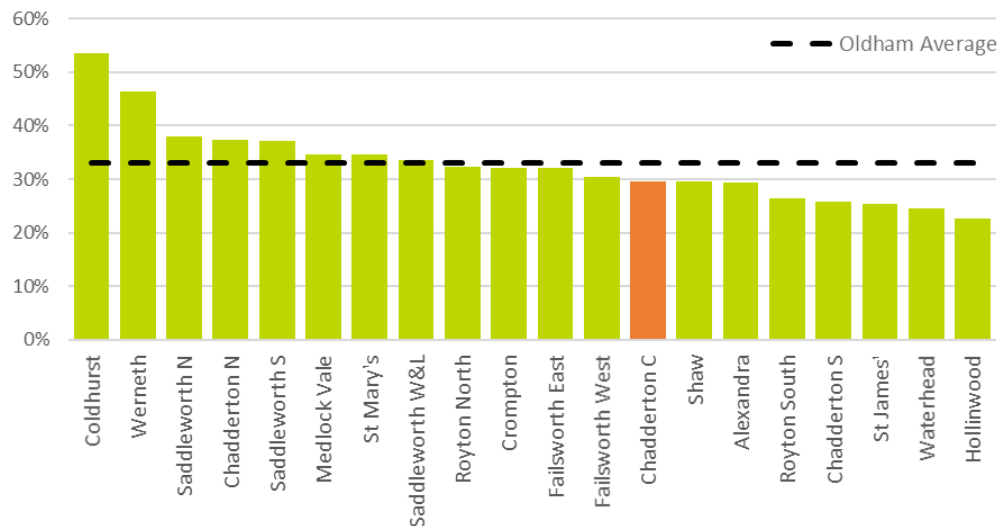

Chadderton Central Ward consists of various communities including large residential areas such as Firwood Park and areas of disadvantage such as the Crossley Estate and Mona Road Estate. There is also an area of new development such as Redrow on the Foxdenton site, which may ultimately accommodate up to some 500 homes. The Ward Accommodates two large secondary Schools (John Henry Newman College and The Radclyffe School) close to each other and also in close proximity to Broadway, a busy trunk road, which is undergoing several modifications to improve traffic flow and also prepare for the new spine road which will join Broadway at Crossley Bridge. Road safety is absolute paramount given the proximity of many primary and secondary schools to busy main roads. Foxdenton Park and Crossley Playing Fields are important open spaces for recreational use and efforts are also being made to create a pocket park on Agnes Street and Robinson Street. Much work has also been done to improve the condition of alleyways on Denton Lane and Queens Road in recent years but need the support of residents if this improvement is to be maintained. Strenuous efforts are also being made to bring the pavilion in Foxdenton Park and the hall back in to community use. Other projects include the Woodland Project (Firwood and District Residents Association) and the Hunt Lane Community Garden (Chadderton Together). There are many projects which seek to engage residents to help improve the local environment and collaborate with the council to work together to obtain support through the grants system. The Community Payback Team have also made a significant contribution.
