ENFORCEMENT NOTICE

ISSUED BY: OLDHAM BOROUGH COUNCIL ("the Council")

- THIS IS A FORMAL NOTICE which is issued by the Council because it appears to them that there has been a breach of planning control, under section 171A(1)(a) of the above Act, at the land described below. They consider that it is expedient to issue this notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations.
- 2. THE LAND AFFECTED

Land at 32 Avon Road, Chadderton, Oldham shown edged red on the attached plan ("the land").

THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL ALLEGED 3.

Without planning permission, the installation of a motorised rotator unit to a radio mast in the approximate position marked with a cross on the attached plan.

REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE 4.

It appears to the Council that the above breach of planning control has occurred within the last four years. The installation of the motorised rotator unit allows the radio mast and associated antennae to be electrically rotated remotely. The frequent rotation of the mast by reason of noise and general disturbance is detrimental to the residential amenity of adjacent residential properties. and as such the remote controlled motorised rotator unit is contrary to the provisions of Policy W1.6 of the Oldham Unitary Development Plan. In addition, a retrospective planning application which sought authorisation for the installation of the motorised rotator unit (along with other development) was refused by the Council's Chadderton Area Committee on the 28th March 2002.

5. WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

Remove the motorised rotator unit from the radio mast.

Time for Compliance: Two months after this notice takes effect.

WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT

This notice takes effect on 8th August 2002 unless an appeal is made against it beforehand.

YOUR RIGHT OF APPEAL

You can appeal against this notice, but any appeal must be received, or posted in time to be received, by the Secretary of State before the 8th August 2002. The enclosed bookle "Enforcement Appeals - A Guide to Procedure" sets out your rights. Read it carefully. You may use the enclosed appeal forms. One is for you to send to the Secretary of State if you decide to appeal, one is for you to keep as a duplicate for your own records, and one is to be forwarded to the Local Authority. You should also send the Secretary of State the spare copy of this enforcement notice which is enclosed.

WHAT HAPPENS IF YOU DO NOT APPEAL

If you do not appeal against this enforcement notice, it will take effect on the 8th August 2002 and you must then ensure that the required steps for complying with it, for which you may be held responsible, are taken within the period(s) specified in the notice. Failure to comply with an enforcement notice which has taken effect can result in prosecution and/or remedial action by the Council.
