ENFORCEMENT NOTICE

ISSUED BY: OLDHAM BOROUGH COUNCIL ("the Council")

1. THIS IS A FORMAL NOTICE which is issued by the Council because it appears to them that there has been a breach of planning control, under section 171A(1)(a) of the above Act, at the land described below. They consider that it is expedient to issue this notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations.

THE LAND AFFECTED

The land at 23 Richmond Avenue, Royton, Oldham shown edged red on the attached plan ("the plan").

THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL ALLEGED

Without planning permission, the erection of a fence adjacent to the highway between the points marked A-B-C on the plan, the height of which exceeds one metre above ground level.

4. REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE

It appears to the Council that the above breach of planning control has occurred within the last four years. The fence is harmful to the street scene because of its height, design and location.

5. WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

Reduce the height of the fence to no more than one metre above ground level.

Period for Compliance: Two months after this notice takes effect.

6. WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT

This notice takes effect on 26th May 2004 unless an appeal is made against it beforehand.

YOUR RIGHT OF APPEAL

You can appeal against this notice, but any appeal must be received, or posted in time to be received, by the Secretary of State before the 26th May 2004. One is for you to send to the Secretary of State if you decide to appeal, one is for you to keep as a duplicate for your own records, and one is to be forwarded to the Local Authority. You should also send the Secretary of State the spare copy of this enforcement notice which is enclosed.

WHAT HAPPENS IF YOU DO NOT APPEAL

If you do not appeal against this enforcement notice, it will take effect on the 26th May 2004 and you must then ensure that the required steps for complying with it, for which you may be held responsible, are taken within the period(s) specified in the notice. Failure to comply with an enforcement notice which has taken effect can result in prosecution and/or remedial action by the Council.
