




- Chadderton North's population in 2018 is roughly the same as it was in 2011 (an increase of less than 1%). This compares to the Oldham wide average increase of 3.9%.
- Since 2001, this ward has seen a growth in the proportion of non-white residents, with significant growth in the Bangladeshi communities (in the area to the South East of Broadway.) Specifically, the proportion of Bangladeshi's in the Ward increased from 1.8% in 2001 to 15.7% in 2011.





Households in Fuel Poverty (Oldham average - 12.1%)

- Chadderton North's housing stock has a large proportion of owner occupied properties (74.4%) and a growing number of private rented properties (9.0%).
- The average sold house price in the ward is 16.25% higher than the Oldham average.
- A low proportion of households have pre-pay energy meters (13%), are in Fuel Poverty (11.9%), and 56% can afford to keep their house in a decent state of repair.




Early Years
"Good Level of Development"

(Oldham average - 68.1%)

- 64.2% of pupils in Chadderton North leave the Early Years Foundation Stage with a Good Level of Development. This compares to 68.1% in Oldham as a whole.
- 65.7% of pupils attain Grade 4 or above in English and Maths GCSE, compared with 56.1% in Oldham as a whole.
- 1.5% of pupils gain no GCSE passes, compared with 2.7% in Oldham as a whole.


Female Life Expectancy

- Chadderton North's Female Life Expectancy (82.7 years) is higher than the Oldham wide average for females (80.9 years).
- Breastfeeding rates are higher than the Oldham average, and a similar proportion of Year 6 children (23.1%) are obese as in Oldham as a whole (23.4%).





Chadderton North consists of various communities including large residential areas between Chadderton Hall Road to Broadway and through to Victoria Street with a social housing estate on Cedar Crescent. To the North-West of the ward there are semi-rural areas such as Chadderton Fold and Heights Lane. The ward is served by three Primary Schools, one Preparatory School and one Secondary School. Chadderton North is well resourced with green spaces which include Mill Brow, the open space on Broadway facing the fire station, Fitton Park bowling green and Chadderton Hall Park (which adjoins to the Rochdale to Leeds canal). There is also a football and Lacrosse pitch across from Clayton Playing Fields. It also houses the Chadderton Wellbeing Centre on Burnley Street, off Middleton Road. The ward serves the wider Oldham community as it is one of the gateways to the M62 which stretches the breadth of England (Liverpool to Hull) via a small trunk road the A627(M) which also provides a direct link to Rochdale.
