



- 97.3% of its residents are White the second highest proportion of any Ward (Saddleworth South is 97.5% White).
- The number of residents aged over 65 has increased by 29% between 2011 and 2018.
- The number of residents aged 0-15 has decreased by 11.6% between 2001 and 2018.



- The employment rate (67%) is higher than the Oldham average (58%).
- A lower proportion of people are on Out of Work Benefits in Saddleworth North (4.7%) than in Oldham as a whole (11.0%).



- Households in Fuel Poverty (Oldham average 12.1%)
- Saddleworth North's housing stock has a large proportion of owner occupied properties (82.2%) and a low proportion of social rented houses (6.6%).
- The average sold house price in the ward is 86% higher than the Oldham average.
- A low proportion of households are receiving Council Tax Reduction and/or Housing Benefit (6.8%) or have pre-pay energy meters (4%). 77% can afford to keep their house in a decent state of repair.




Early Years "Good Level of Development"

(Oldham average - 68.1%)

- 89.4% of pupils in Saddleworth North enter the Early Years Foundation stage with a Good Level of Development. This compares to 68.1% in Oldham as a whole.
- 75.7% of pupils attain Grade 4 or above in English and Maths GCSE, compared with 56.1% in Oldham as a whole.
- 1.9% of pupils gain no GCSE passes, compared with 2.7% in Oldham as a whole.







Saddleworth North has a largely healthy, prosperous, and well educated population. With a landscape of valleys and villages where it's population is settled, Denshaw, Delph, Dobcross, Diggle, Scouthead, and Austerlands all lie within the Saddleworth Parish Council.

Large areas of the ward are characterised by heather moorland with many recreational cycling, walking and riding routes including the

Huddersfield Narrow Canal which runs through the villages of Diggle and Dobcross. The ward is a very desirable place to live - which is reflected in high property values. But local employment opportunities are limited, leading to concerns that it is becoming a dormitory area for adjoining towns on both sides of the Pennines.

Dispersed settlements, reduction in local village amenities, and relatively large aging population have led to concerns around issues of isolation and loneliness amongst its residents—though there is a strong sense of village identity and responsibility, with active community and residents associations, voluntary associations, events, and festivals throughout the year. The voluntary, faith, and community sectors, with support from Council and partners, are working hard to help residents feel more connected.
