









Saddleworth West and Lees Ward Map





- Saddleworth West and Lees is 97.1% White. This is the third highest proportion in the borough, behind only Saddleworth South (97.5%) and Saddleworth North (97.3%).
- The number of residents aged over 65 has increased by 18% between 2011 and 2018.
- The number of residents aged 0-15 has decreased by 8.6% between 2011 and 2018, and numbers are low.



- Saddleworth West and Lees has the third highest median household income (£27,987) in the borough. This is 26% higher than the Oldham average (£22,289).
- The employment rate (68%) is higher than the Oldham average (58%).
- A lower proportion of people are on Out of Work Benefits in Saddleworth West and Lees (8.2%) than in Oldham as a whole (11.0%).



- Saddleworth West and Lees's housing stock has a large proportion of owner occupied properties (77.5%), and a low proportion of social rented properties (8.7%).
- The average sold house price in the ward is 9.8% higher than the Oldham average.
- A low proportion of households are receiving Council Tax Reduction and/or Housing Benefit (10.9%) or have pre-pay energy meters (5%). 75% can afford to keep their house in a decent state of repair.





82.6% of pupils in Saddleworth West and Lees leave the Early Years Foundation stage with a Good Level of Development. This compares to 68.1% in Oldham as a whole.

- 58.9% of pupils attain Grade 4 or above in English and Maths GCSE, compared with 56.1% in Oldham as a whole.
- 3.3% of pupils gain no GCSE passes, compared with 2.7% in Oldham as a whole.







Saddleworth West and Lees ward is the most heavily populated of the three Saddleworth wards, and has a more urban feel with housing situated in the villages of Grotton, Springhead, and Lees. Grotton and part of Springhead are situated within the Saddleworth Parish Council Boundary.

The more abundant supply of housing means that house prices are more affordable than Saddleworth North and South, though it is still considered to be an aspirational and attractive place to live.

Lees is the largest of the villages and is considered a district centre with a range of shops, employment opportunities, and amenities along with a more lively night time economy. There is a choice of pubs and restaurants, along with good transport links into Oldham Town Centre and Manchester beyond. However, along with other similar sized district centres, there is local concern over the vitality of the village centre and a desire to improve the environment and encourage investment in the local economy. There is an active pub and business watch who are working with local Councillors and Officers to keep the village a safe and attractive place to visit and invest.

Grotton, Springhead, and Lees all have active communities and a strong sense of identity.
