Our waste service provides assisted collections to residents who are physically unable to put their bins out for collection. Around **2,500 assisted collections** are provided every week for reasons of:

- disability
- age (infirmity)
- pregnancy/maternity

In addition, we have targeted over **11,000 households in ethnically diverse communities** with tailored communications in order that these residents are not prevented from effectively utilising our recycling services.
