Liz is an experienced Primary School teacher who has over twenty years teaching experience in both state and independent schools in Cheshire and Oldham. She has many years' experience of leading choirs at Oldham Music Service where she currently conducts the Youth Choir. In 2014 she completed a Masters Degree in Education (Music), focussing on creating singing schools, reflecting on current practice teaching at EYFS and KS1, assessment and learning in a creative subject and examining suitable repertoire for boys with changing voices at KS3. She is currently Subject Leader for Curriculum Music at the Oldham Music Service.



This course will give lots of practical ideas and resources to NQTs for both teaching music, but also incorporating music into all areas of the curriculum, helping with classroom routines and behaviour. The session will include ideas for leading singing, using percussion instruments in the classroom, composing and performing and planning for linking music to other areas of the curriculum.

### An intervention programme for children at risk of developmental delay

#### Led by Susan Mann BA (Hons) PGCE

Susan has a 30 year track record of success in motivating and progressing young people as a music teacher and workshop leader. She is the writer of the 'Can Do' primary intervention programme and 'Anyone Can Play' scheme of work for special schools.

This course will help withdrawn children communicate and smile, distracted children focus and listen and anxious children interact and relax. It is designed to be run in small groups by teaching assistants and consists of tried and tested plans using some of the best audio tracks available to motivate children and help them to develop focus and concentration, confidence and self-esteem, waiting and turn-taking, positive



interaction and leading and following. The course is totally hands-on with lots of practical ideas and strategies.

No specialist musical knowledge is required and it is open to all teachers and teaching assistants. Delegates will receive a resource pack containing 25 tracks, planning for a year and extension activities.

Workshop sessions will be covering:


- Understanding and appraising music and how it is assessed
