The forms

There are two forms that it is essential you complete:

- Event Notification Form
- Risk Assessment

The **Event Notification Form** is to let the council know about your Street Party – when, where, what, etc. This is so that we can work with you to identify what needs to be done before your event (e.g. closing off your street) and ensure you have everything you need to have a safe and successful street party.

The **Risk Assessment** is to ensure that everyone is able to enjoy the party safely. Of course, no-one wants an event where something unexpected happens or someone gets injured – and the risk assessment form is here to help you consider all the possible hiccups, so that you can plan to avoid them.

Bunting

Invites

It's important to tell people when and where your party is happening. We have provided an invitation template to help you create yours – again, it is in the box.

Food and recipes

Party Games and activities

Here are three ideas for your street party which could help work up an appetite and turn unwanted items into hidden treasure.

1. Games for a laugh

- Ask your neighbours to bring their garden games out – swing ball or tennis or giant dominoes – anything goes.
- Maybe have a sports day and do a tug of war, egg and spoon race, three-legged race or even pin the tail on the donkey.
- For those less actively inclined ask neighbours to bring out their board games – Pictionary, Trivial Pursuit or even a simple deck of cards to keep everyone entertained.

2. Freecycle your street

A freecycle event is where people bring their unwanted items and others pick them up. This could be a great opportunity to have a clear out and help out the neighbours.

3. Share your skills

Ask your neighbours if they have any skills they could share with others on the street. From teaching people how to ride a bike to fixing a bike, or growing fruit or veg, or knitting a woolly hat – why not see what great assets you have on your street and get sharing.



Top tips

Here are our top tips to help your street party go with a swing.

- 1. Set up a Facebook group for your street to help get everyone involved and swap street party ideas.
- 2. Tap into the competitive nature of your neighbours and organise some competitions from best cake to knobbliest knees.
- 3. Nowhere to sit? Don't worry, ask your neighbours to bring their garden furniture, deckchairs, cushions and even bean bags.
- 4. Anybody good with a BBQ? Always a great addition to any party, but remember to ensure food is thoroughly cooked.
- 5. Make sure you ask if anyone has any dietary requirements e.g. vegetarian or gluten-free and check any allergies are catered for.
- 6. Ask local businesses if they are willing to donate food to the party or prizes for competitions in return for advertising at the event.
- 7. If you are going to promote the event or post pictures of the event to social media, check everyone is happy with that first.
- 8. Make a rainy day plan so that you can still go ahead even if the Oldham weather lives up to its reputation.
- 9. On the day, make sure everyone moves their cars why not encourage the children to do a car wash help raise money for charity.
- 10. If anyone from the next street along wants to join in, why not invite them and encourage them to have a party too.

We don't have the monopoly on good ideas, so we've pulled together the best of the rest to help you get the most out of your party.
